**Area freedom statement provided - Conditions**

a) A Department of Agriculture import permit is not required.

b) The plant material must be identifiable by a botanical name.

To demonstrate compliance with this requirement you must present the following on a [Bill of Lading](#), [Air waybill](#), [Commercial invoice](#), [Manufacturer's declaration](#), [Exporter declaration](#), [Treatment certificate](#) or [Phytosanitary certificate](#):

The botanical name of the plant material.

c) The timber must be harvested from an area where *Phytophthora ramorum* is not known to occur.

To demonstrate compliance with this requirement you must present the following on a [Phytosanitary certificate](#):

The additional declaration "The timber was harvested from areas free of *Phytophthora ramorum* (known as causing the sudden oak death disease)."

d) Timber must be free from pests and disease.

To demonstrate compliance with this requirement you must present the following on a [Phytosanitary certificate](#) or [Methyl bromide fumigation certificate](#):

1. Evidence that the goods have been fumigated with methyl bromide at a rate of 48g/m<sup>3</sup> for 24 hours at 21°C and above at normal atmospheric pressure (NAP), or
2. Evidence that the goods have been fumigated with methyl bromide at a rate of 64 g/m<sup>3</sup> for 4 hours at 21°C and above under vacuum (660 mm vacuum), or
3. Evidence that the goods have been fumigated with methyl bromide at a rate of 64 g/m<sup>3</sup> for 5 hours at 10-20°C under vacuum (660 mm vacuum).

If Country of origin is New Zealand then:

Treatment must be completed within 90 days of export.

If Grown in a country other than New Zealand then:

Treatment must be completed within 21 days of export.

OR

You must present the following on a [Phytosanitary certificate](#) or [Fumigation certificate](#):

Evidence that the goods have been treated with sulphuryl fluoride fumigation at a rate of 64 g/m<sup>3</sup> (4 lbs/1000 cu ft) for 16 hours at 21 °C (70 °F) or for 24 hours at 15. 5°C or above.

Sulphuryl fluoride fumigation can only be carried out offshore on goods without impervious coatings.

If Country of origin is New Zealand then:

Treatment must be completed within 90 days of export.

If Grown in a country other than New Zealand then:

Treatment must be completed within 21 days of export.

OR

You must present the following on a [Heat treatment certificate](#):

Evidence that the goods have been heated at a minimum temperature of 56°C for 30 minutes, measured at the core of the goods.

If Country of origin is New Zealand then:

Treatment must be completed within 90 days of export.

If Grown in a country other than New Zealand then:

Treatment must be completed within 21 days of export.

OR

You must present the following on a [Phytosanitary certificate](#) or [Kiln drying treatment certificate](#):

Evidence that the goods have been kiln dried at a rate of 74°C for [variable times](#) depending on the thickness of the goods.

If Country of origin is New Zealand then:

Treatment must be completed within 90 days of export.

If Grown in a country other than New Zealand then:

Treatment must be completed within 21 days of export.

OR

You must present the following on a [Phytosanitary certificate](#) or [Ethylene oxide treatment certificate](#):

1. Evidence that the goods have been fumigated with ethylene oxide under initial minimum vacuum of 50 kilopascals at a rate of 1200g/m<sup>3</sup> for 5 hours at 50°C, or
2. Evidence that the goods have been fumigated with ethylene oxide under initial minimum vacuum of 50 kilopascals at a rate of 1500g/m<sup>3</sup> for 24 hours at 21°C.

OR

You must present the following on a [Phytosanitary certificate](#) or [Permanent preservative treatment certificate](#):

Evidence that permanent preservative treatments have taken place in accordance with [the department's timber permanent preservative treatment requirements](#).

OR

You must present the following on a [Gamma irradiation treatment certificate](#):

Evidence that goods have been subject to gamma irradiation at a rate of 10kGray (1.0 Mrad).

- e) The goods must be clean and free of prohibited seed, soil, animal and plant debris and other [biosecurity risk material](#) prior to arrival in Australia.
- f) Any packaging used with the consignment must be clean and new.
- g) Please note that timber related products that have been previously exported from Australia and are then imported to Australia after processing are classed as foreign and are subject to meet the Department of Agriculture's import requirements.
- h) The department will release the goods once all of the import requirements have been met.
- i) Under the [Quarantine Service Fees Determination 2005](#), fees are payable to the Department of Agriculture for all services. A list of all [quarantine & export fees](#) is available on the Department of Agriculture's website.
- j) Non-commodity information requirements for imported cargo also apply, please refer to the BICON case [Non-Commodity Cargo Clearance](#).

**Area freedom statement not provided - Conditions**

- a) A Department of Agriculture import permit is not required.
- b) The plant material must be identifiable by a botanical name.

To demonstrate compliance with this requirement you must present the following on a [Bill of Lading](#), [Air waybill](#), [Commercial invoice](#), [Manufacturer's declaration](#), [Exporter declaration](#), [Treatment certificate](#) or [Phytosanitary certificate](#):

The botanical name of the plant material.

- c) Timber must be free from pests and disease.

To demonstrate compliance with this requirement you must present the following on a [Gamma irradiation treatment certificate](#):

Evidence that goods have been subject to gamma irradiation at a rate of 25kGray (2.5 Mrad).

OR

You must present the following on a [Heat treatment certificate](#):

Evidence that the goods have been heated at a minimum temperature of 56°C for 30 minutes, measured at the core of the goods.

If Country of origin is New Zealand then:

Treatment must be completed within 90 days of export.

If Grown in a country other than New Zealand then:

Treatment must be completed within 21 days of export.

OR

You must present the following on a [Phytosanitary certificate](#) or [Kiln drying treatment certificate](#):

Evidence that the goods have been kiln dried at a rate of 74°C for [variable times](#) depending on the thickness of the goods.

If Country of origin is New Zealand then:

Treatment must be completed within 90 days of export.

If Grown in a country other than New Zealand then:

Treatment must be completed within 21 days of export.

- d) The goods must be clean and free of prohibited seed, soil, animal and plant debris and other [biosecurity risk material](#) prior to arrival in Australia.
- e) Any packaging used with the consignment must be clean and new.
- f) Please note that timber related products that have been previously exported from Australia and are then imported to Australia after processing are classed as foreign and are subject to meet the Department of Agriculture's import requirements.
- g) The department will release the goods once all of the import requirements have been met.
