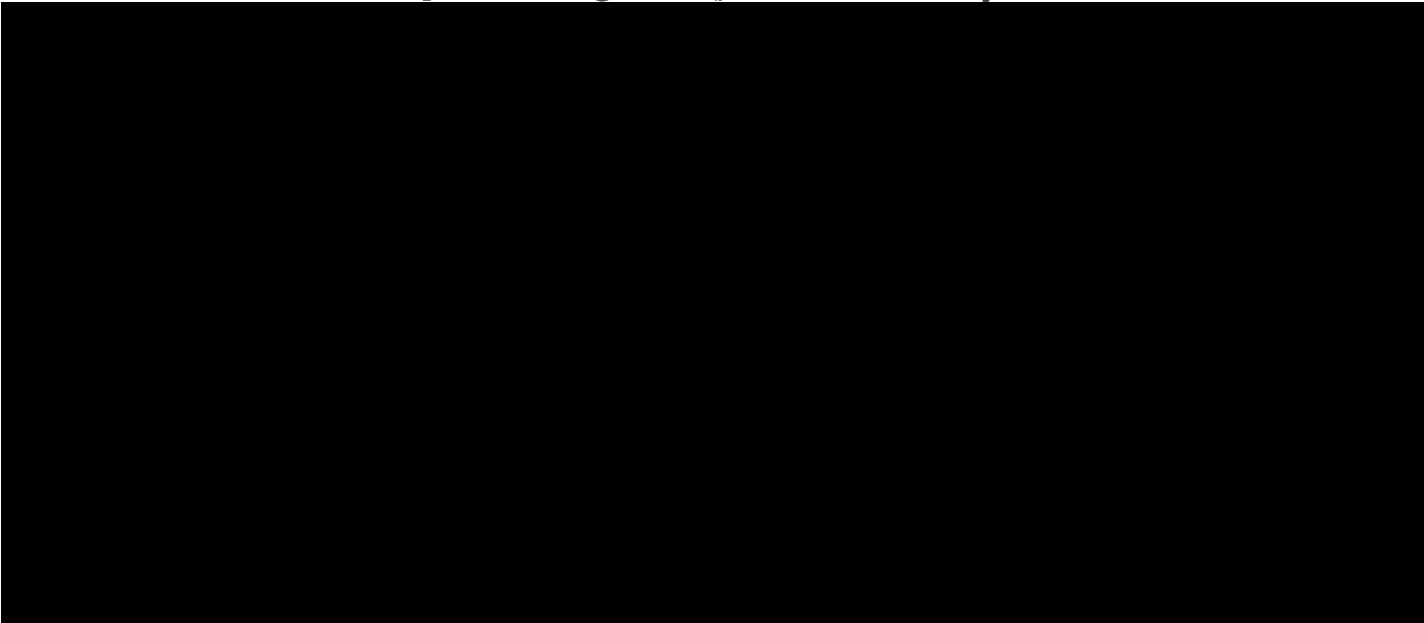

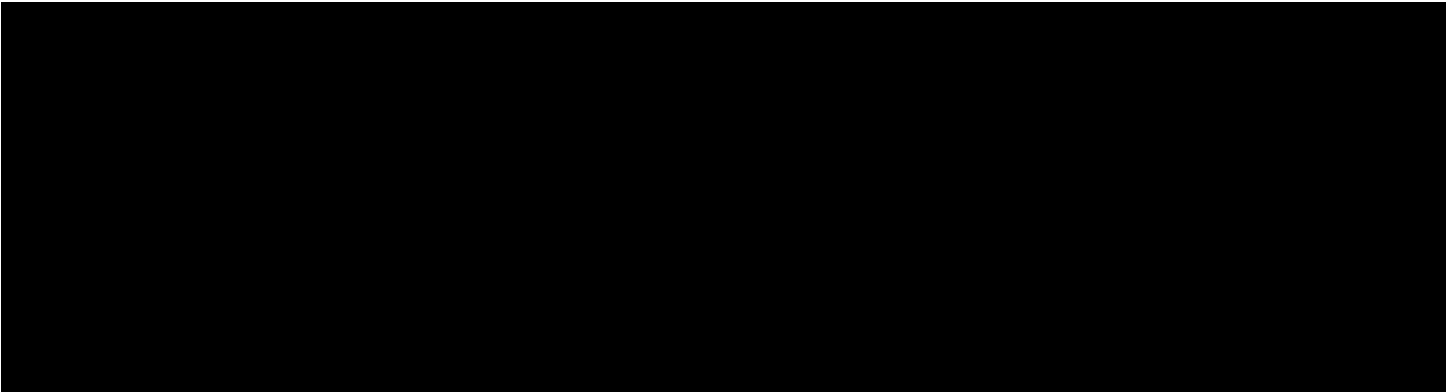


Effective from 1 August 2013, all health certificates produced from EXDOC will be printed on new paper featuring the Australian coat of arms and the words 'Australian Government' where 'AQIS' once appeared. A sample of this paper is attached. This change does not affect manually generated health certificates which will continue to be printed on plain paper without the watermark.

Phasing out the AQIS name and transitioning to Australian Government or DAFF is largely a visual change. There will be:

- no change to the services provided as a result of the change in identity
- no change to the biosecurity functions undertaken by the Australian Government
- no change to systems, processes and people as a result of the new name, and
- no impact upon the competent authority under which audit, inspections and certifications are undertaken. These services continue to be undertaken by the Australian Government.
