1.1	Title	Eradication of an outbreak of Tomato brown rugose fruit virus (ToBRFV) in Germany (North Rhine-Westphalia)	
1.2	Executive summary	In 2023, ToBRFV has been found in a greenhouse in North Rhine-Westphalia. The infested tomato plants were used for tomato fruit production.	
		A demarcated area has been established and official eradication measures were taken.	
		In 2024, samples of young plants as well as surfaces were analyzed but no infestation with ToBRFV has been detected. The infestation is therefore considered eradicated. Furthermore, ToBRFV has been regulated as a Regulated Non-Quarantine Pest (RNQP) since January 2025.

7.1	Adoption of official phytosanitary measures.	Official phytosanitary measures have been taken. Those measures are taken inside the demarcated area.
		Hygiene measures were carried out to effectively prevent the virus from spreading by employees, tools, machines, means of transport and during packaging. After the end of the tomato production the greenhouse were cleaned of all tomato plants, the whole plant material was destroyed. Disinfection of all greenhouse surfaces and all objects that were involved in tomato production including the materials that were used in the clearance.
